

Do You Comply with the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974?

Under Section 2 of the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974, employers have a legal duty to provide training for their employees to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, their health and safety at work. The Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999 identify situations where health and safety training is particularly important, including:

- Training for new recruits
- Training for when people change jobs or take on extra responsibilities
- Training for young, more vulnerable employees
- Refresher training where existing skills need updating

Who needs this qualification?

This Level 2 British Safety Council approved training course is suitable for workers of all abilities, designed to maintain employee's health and safety knowledge and to provide employers with evidence of legal compliance with regards to training records.

Why is this qualification important?

Recent changes in sentencing guidelines has led to considerably higher fines for health & safety offences - so it also makes commercial sense to protect your organisation from the increased financial risk. Well trained employees are less likely to have accidents, which improves overall employee morale and reduces the possibility of successful civil damage claims following work-related accidents.

Qualification content and cost

This one-day Level 2 health and safety in the workplace course is designed to provide employees with the requisite knowledge, or refresher training, needed in order to provide a safe working environment within your organisation. This includes an understanding of legal responsibilities, accident prevention and an overview of key areas of workplace health and safety.
